THE JAMMU AND KASHMIR RESERVATION RULES, 2005

Social Welfare Department Notification SRO-294 dated 21st October, 2005

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Jammu and Kashmir Reservation Act, 2004, section 22 of J&K Persons with Disabilities Act, 1998 and all other relevant provisions of the law in this behalf, the Government hereby makes the following rules :-

1. Short title and commencement. - (1) These rules may be called the Jammu and Kashmir Reservation Rules, 2005.

 1 [(2) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Government Gazette].

2. Definitions. - In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,-

- (i) "Act" mean the Jammu and Kashmir Reservation Act, 2004;
- (ii) "Annexure" mean the Annexure to these rules;
- (iii) "Areas adjoining the Actual Line of Control" mean the areas declared as such vide SRO-394 dated 5-9-1981 read with notification SRO-272 dated 3-7-1982 and SRO 271 dated 22-8-1988 as amended from time to time, forming Annexure – "A" to these rules;
- (iv) "Available seats" means seats against which admissions are to be made in respect of a course in professional institutions, as hereinafter defined;
- (v) "Backward Area" mean the villages/areas declared as socially and educationally backward vide SRO-394 dated 5-9-1981 read with notification SRO:272 dated 3-7-1982 and SRO-271 dated 22-8-1988 as amended from time to time, forming Annexure – "B" to these rules;
- (vi) "Candidates possessing outstanding proficiency in sports" mean a sports person as defined under the Jammu and Kashmir Certification of Outstanding Proficiency in Sports Rules, 1996, as amended from time to time, forming Annexure-"C" to these rules;
- (vii) "Children" mean the direct descendents but shall not include grandchildren;
- (viii) "Children of Defence Personnel" mean the children of those Permanent Residents of the State who are serving in Army, Navy or Air Force or having served as such and had been

13. Reservation in Professional Institutions. - Except as hereinafter provided, seats shall be reserved for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Socially and Educationally Backward Classes in each course of professional institutions which shall, as nearly as possible, constitute such a percentage of the available seats in that course as shown against each category or group hereinafter: -

15. Distribution of seats. - For the post-graduate courses in MD/MS/M.Tech, Engineering and Agricultural Sciences and similar other postgraduate courses, the seats shall be distributed as follows with the condition that the selection of candidates from the reserved categories for different streams shall be made strictly on the basis of their inter-se merit, treating them as a single class for purpose of allotment of streams: -

1. In case any of the seats remain vacant in a Reserved Category for want of eligible candidates, the same will be offered to the candidates of non-reserved i.e. open merit group.

2. If a candidate gets admitted under Reserved Category and is also placed on the consolidated waiting list of General Category and gets a General Category seat on merit, the seat shall be offered to him/her subject to the condition that the candidate of categories fulfill the minimum eligibility requirement of General Category and his/her Reserved Category seat shall fall vacant and shall be offered in order of merit to the next candidate of the Reserved Category.

Supernumerary Seats

In addition to normal intake, the following number of supernumerary seats will be available to the eligible candidates of following categories:

- (i) Candidates with disabilities (Orthopedically One seat in each programme Handicapped and Blind candidates)
- (ii) Single Girl Child

- 5.5. Each candidate who is granted admission shall not take up any employment or engage in any business or profession so long as he/she is on the rolls of the University. Any student who takes up an employment or engages in business or profession in violation of the Statutes, his/her name shall be struck off from the rolls of the teaching department of the School/College of the University.
- 5.6. Students seeking admission after Re-evaluation shall be granted admission only if
 - i. seats remain vacant
 - ii. the request is made within fifteen days from the last date of admission.

Further, no admission shall be granted to Bi-annual pass students of the same year.

5.7 Refund of Fee:

As per UGC circular, a full refund of fees should be made on account of all cancellations of admissions up to October 31, 2021 for the academic session 2021- 2022 as a special case. On cancellation/ withdrawal of admissions up to December 31, 2021, the entire fee collected from a student should be refunded in full after deducting not more than Rs.1000/- as processing fee. Thereafter, no request for refund shall be entertained.

SEAT AVAILABILITY (APPLICABLE TO ALL MERIT AND ENTRANCE BASED PROGRAMMES):

From the total seats, 51% seats are available for open category students whereas remaining 49% seats are meant for reserved category students as listed in Table 6.1. below. In addition, 10 % of the intake is also available for EWS (Economic Weaker Section) Students, which is over and above the normal intake.

6.1 Reserved Category Seats percentage

Explanation:

- (i) For determining the number of seats under any reserved category mentioned in table 6.1, fraction of less than one-half shall be ignored and fraction of one half and more shall be treated as one. However, the benefit of fraction shall be given to each category separately even if it means an overall marginal increase in seats in any course of study.
- (ii) Selection of candidates against reserved seats specified in table 6.1 shall be made on the basis of comparative merit in the respective category which will be determined in accordance with the criteria prescribed for categories (1), (2), (3) & (4).
- (iii) To be a beneficiary of reservation, the candidate must be a domicile of J&K UT, except when applying under above categories: (5) Sports (6) Cultural & Literary activities (7) N.C.C and (8) NSS/Bharat Scouts & Guides activities, for which he/she must have passed the qualifying examination from any recognized Board/University within the Jammu Province. (Detailed procedure for assessment in Achievement Categories is attached at Annexure-15)

6.2. Seat Matrix:

Seat Matrix of intake capacity of various schools and constituent Colleges of the Cluster University for the session 2020-21 is enclosed at Annexure-19.

6.3. Transfer of Seats:

- In case any of the seats remain vacant in a reserved category for want of eligible candidates, the same will be offered to the candidates of non-reserved i.e. open merit group.
- ii. If a candidate gets admitted under Reserved Category and is also placed on the consolidated waiting list of General Category and gets a General Category seat on merit, the seat shall be offered to him/her subject to the condition that the candidate of categories fulfill the minimum eligibility requirement of General Category and his / her Reserved Category seat shall fall vacant and shall be offered in order of merit to the next candidate of the Reserved Category.

6.4. Supernumerary seats

In addition to normal intake, the following number of supernumerary seats will be available to the eligible candidates for categories listed below:

- Candidates with disabilities (Orthopedically Handicapped and Blind Candidates) - one seat in each programme.
- ii) Single Girl Child one seat in each programme
- iii) Kashmiri Migrant one seat in each programme
- iv) Self-financing seats 30% in each programme [For Programmes as listed in Annexure-21]

NOTE:

(a) Candidate suffering a degree of disability of 40% and above and visually impaired candidates are eligible for admission under category (i) of 6.4. Certificate of an orthopedically handicapped or visually impaired shall be considered only if it is issued by the Head of the Department of Orthopedics or that of Ophthalmology of a Government Medical College/District Hospital.

The Vice-Chancellor, if he/she so desires, may seek advice in the matter, of a Committee to be appointed by him/her on the recommendations of the Registrar.
