6.3.1 Curriculum Development

College does not design the courses but the faculty members, through statutory bodies, participate in the process. To introduce new programmes or courses within the regulation of the state Government and University system, the college takes three to four months. The college is represented in the Board of study by a senior faculty member who interacts with the parent university on suggestion and observations about all the academic issues and help in bringing suitable changes periodically. They play a vital role in updating the syllabi and making them more relevant to the society and industry.

Admissions to the various courses of study are made in accordance with the policy of reservation of the Govt. Of Jammu and Kashmir. An entrance examination is held to judge the student's knowledge and aptitude at the entry level in Bachelor of Commerce Hon's. The teachers personally look after the difficulties faced by students and extends all help at the time of need. The college follows teaching schedule as per the university academic calendar. The syllabi are divided according to the semester system of teaching. The internal assessment tests are conducted as per University rules. In courses where job training is necessary, students have to submit the project report after undergoing industrial training. Guest faculties are also invited from the academic or allied industrial sectors to share their expertise and to provide practical skills to the students

The college follows examination schedule as per the University academic calendar. Both external and internal assessment tests are conducted as per the University rules.

The college does not carry any research activities and only caters the need of one Post Graduate and four Undergraduate Programmes.

The College is located in the heart of Jammu city with organized campus of 3.72 acres and has a good computer laboratory with internet facility.
